Michael Grear Surveys has been proud to be involved with the recently completed grain handling port at Lucky Bay. Our involvement (Since late 2018) has been with the construction phase of the new silos and grain handling infrastructure.

One of our Surveying Team, James, has been the main surveyor providing his expertise with the set-out support to the different phases of the port construction.

#### From the T Ports Website:

- Lucky Bay is an innovative port development on South Australia's Eyre Peninsula.
- The \$130 million development is South Australia's first farmer and private equity partnership port, which involved securing private investor equity and debt.
- Lucky Bay now offers an alternative grain storage and export option.
- The development would not have been possible without the support of 120 growers who expressed interest in delivering grain to Lucky Bay and Lock.

#### Features

- Steel silos with approximately 24,000 tonnes of storage
- The site features 360,000 tonnes of grain storage in 10 bunkers
- The state-of-the-art, transshipment vessel has a loading capacity of up to 13,800 t/day

#### A Message From Luke

A common mark a surveyor will establish at a location is a Temporary Benchmark (TBM). This is particularly important for builders.

TBMs are designed to remove ambiguity of interpretation and form a reliable basis on which other work may proceed. More often than not, we look for a nearby Stobie pole to ensure our TBM will be accessible for as long as possible.



TBMs on a survey plan are depicted by a broad arrow. Whenever a TBM is established and a plan produced, some information regarding that TBM; a description of its location, how it can be identified, and the height of the TBM as it relates to the datum of the plan.
