at the Victoria Park Track, Nigel Barker made his attempt to ride a rickshaw as far as he could ride in one hour. He needed to make at least 10 km to gain a record.








In preparation for the day, Mark Whitford and Michael Grear used our Trimble R10

Survey Grade GPS Unit to measure the prescribed course. The rules stated that if there was an incline that this would determine the direction of the course, up the incline.

As part laps distance of the course could also be counted, Michael Grear attended the attempt to officiate the total distance. At 11am Nigel Barker completed a course of 17.7km in one hour. After paper work to the Guinness World Records was sent and accepted, Nigel now holds the record for the longest distance on a rickshaw in one hour. Congratulation Nigel and support team!

Did you recognise the lion statue, pictured in the last edition of *The Survey Datum*?



Well done to a number of observant readers!

You would find it outside Adelaide's Parliament House.

The Rampant Lion for Parliament House.

These are the headlines from the Adelaide paper, The Mail, (now The Advertiser), on Saturday 22nd January 1938.

As reported on this day, the carved stone Lion is a piece of monumental stonework from the Westminster Houses of Parliament, promised to the South Australian branch of the Empire Parliamentary Association to be incorporated into the new Parliament House wing on North Terrace. You will find it located to the west of and below the main steps.

The lion was given to South Australia as "another link that binds the Commonwealth to the mother country hoping to introduce a touch of tradition of the English Parliamentary System into the newest legislative building."

It was also timed as a gift commemorating the 150 Anniversary Celebrations of British Colonisation.


